

# GRASSES & GROUNDCOVER

\*Pili – *Heteropogon contortus*  
2-3 ft native dryland bunchgrass, prune biannually for aesthetics and mulch material, deer resistant at maturity. S: 3ft



\*Kāwelu – *Eragrostis variabilis*  
2 ft native grass, self seeding, Partly Shade tolerant. S: 3ft



\*Ilie'e – *Plumbago zeylanica*  
3 ft spreading native plumbago, tolerates most conditions. small blue flowers, sticky seed pods S: 3ft



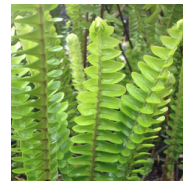
\*Oahu sedge – *Carex oahuensis*  
3ft sedge with elegant weeping foliage. S: 3ft



\*Ahu'awa – *Cyperus javanicus*  
3 ft sedge with stout grey/green foliage, showy seedheads. S: 4ft



\*Kupukupu fern–  
*Nephrolepis cordifolia*  
2 ft sword fern, spreads to fill areas aggressively, excellent weed suppression once established. S: 3ft



\*Palapalai fern –  
*Microlepia strigosa*  
2-3 ft pale green fern, grow for lei, thrives in part shade understory

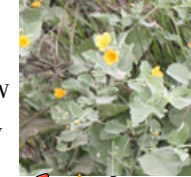


## SHRUBS

\*A'ali'i – *Dodonea viscosa*  
8-12 ft extremely hardy shrub, female plants have colorful seed pods for lei, leaf litter builds soil. S: 6ft



\*'ilima – *Sida fallax*  
5ft gray/green shrub, bright yellow flowers, requires full sun and low water, pollinator friendly. S: 4ft.



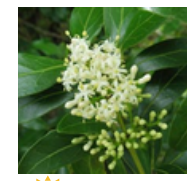
\*Kuluī – *Nototrichium spp.*  
sandwicense 8-12 ft attractive silver foliage shrub



Koki'o ke'oke'o –  
*Hibiscus arnottianus*  
spp. 8-18ft native with large white petaled scented flowers, mature height varies, benefits from pruning annually. S: 6ft



\*Alahe'e – *Psydrax odorata*  
15-20 ft dense evergreen shrub, excellent windbreak, privacy hedge, prune to shape. S: 8ft



\*Māmaki – *Pipturus albidus*  
6-10 ft native nettle with large red-veined leaves, tolerates heavy pruning and shade/sun, leaves for tea. S:6ft



\*'ulei – *Osteomeles anthyllidifolia*  
6 ft sprawling shrub, small white flowers, great understory. S:8ft



\*Maile – *Alyxia stellata*  
Climbing vine, plant on fences/with companions for support, grow for lei. S:4ft



## TREES

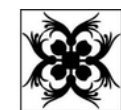
\*Koai'a – *Acacia koaia*  
25 ft a low spreading dry forest canopy tree, lowland koa relative. S: 15ft



\*Naio – *Myoporum sandwicense*  
15-20 ft low spreading dry forest tree, elegant weeping foliage, small white flowers. S:12ft

\*Koa – *Acacia koa*  
 30-60 ft large hardwood tree,  
 leaf litter builds soil,  
 nitrogen fixer. S: 20ft



\*Ōhi'a –  
*Metrosideros polymorpha*  
 6-50 ft a native forest keystone  
 species, growth forms and height  
 vary, striking red, orange, or  
 yellow flowers. S: 15ft



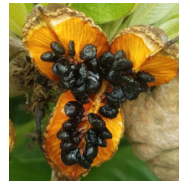
\*īliahī – *Santalum haleakalae*  
 12-30 ft slow growing, requires  
 small plants nearby as  
 companions (hemi-parasitic),  
 fragrant heartwood. S: 12ft



\*ōhe mauka –  
*Polyscias hawaiensis*  
 30-50 ft specimen tree, thrives in  
 kula growing conditions, large-  
 leaved beautiful  
 canopy. S: 15ft



\*Hō'awa – *Pittosporum spp.*  
 15-30 ft dry forest tree, white  
 flower clusters fragrant at night.  
 S:12ft

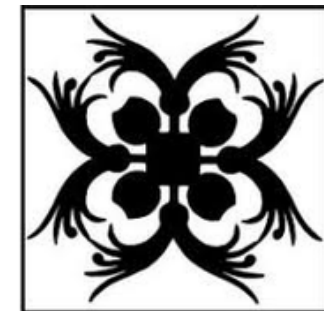


\*Halapepe –  
*Chrysodracon auwahienses*  
 15-30 ft dry forest specimen tree,  
 unique shape and foliage, showy  
 flowers, orange fruit. S: 10ft
